FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Lenten Reflection

Isaiah 6 is a very well known passage of Scripture. In this text, Isaiah enters the Temple and has a spectacular vision of God. Along with the vision of God, the passage is remembered primarily for the call that God gives, and Isaiah's response. "Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me (Isaiah 6:8)!'"

While this is the part of the text we often remember most, I want to draw our attention to what comes immediately before this. After seeing this incredible image of God, Isaiah's first response is to recognize his sinfulness. "And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts (v. 5)!'"

The response in the Temple to this confession is the same as what we practice at church: he is pardoned. "The seraph touched my mouth with [the coal] and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out (v. 7).'"

As we enter the season of Lent, I think we are invited to have this same experience. Lent is a season of confession, a season when we prepare ourselves for Easter by examining ourselves, confessing our sins, and seeking to become more like Jesus in the process. I think this text from Isaiah points out that it is through our encounters with God that we come to understand our sinfulness, truly confess them, receive our true pardon, and are ultimately changed. So as we go through the season of Lent, let us draw near to God. "And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus (Phil. 4:7)."


